

Dear Parent, Loved One, or Guardian,


This is a book that is meant to help your children. Domestic violence takes place in neighborhoods everywhere. Unfortunately, it happens here in DeKalb County,






Before we start our tour, would you draw me a picture of your family?





Would you draw me a picture of your teacher?


You can talk to your teacher about your feelings.

1. Stay out of the fight!






When you dial 911 for an emergency, the police will come to your house.
